ANNUAL EVALUATION

The <u>**DeKalb County School District**</u> will take the following actions to conduct, with the meaningful involvement of parents and family members, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parent and family engagement policy in improving the academic quality of its Title I, Part A schools. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic

minority background). The evaluation will also include identifying the needs of parents and family members to assist with the learning of their children, including engaging with school personnel and teachers and strategies to support successful school and family interactions. RESERVATION OF FUNDS

The <u>**DeKalb County School District**</u> will involve the parents and family members of children served in Title I, Part A schools in decisions about how the 1 percent of Title I, Part A funds reserved for parent and family engagement is spent and will ensure that not less than 90 percent of the 1 percent reserved goes directly to Title I schools.

- Title I School-Level Parent and Family Engagement Community Meetings

COORDINATION OF SERVICES

The <u>**DeKalb County School District**</u> will coordinate and integrate parent and family engagement strategies with parent and family engagement strategies, to the extent feasible and appropriate, with other relevant Federal, State, and local laws and programs that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children by:

1. Providing support from the Office of Federal Programs (OFP).

2. Providing parents' access to Parent Centers at the six regional centers and thirty-six school centers.

3. Extending late hours one day a week for Regional Centers to accommodate the needs of the community, parents and stakeholders.

4. Ensuring residential facilities (Homeless, foster care, and N&D) in the school's attendance area are included in parent and family engagement correspondence and activities

5. Ensuring allocations and equitable services for participating private schools with eligible Title I students

- 3. Title l Parent and Family Engagement Stake Input Meeting (Annually).
- 4. Parent workshops (e.g., Georgia Milestone, Infinite Campus, etc.)

BUILDING CAPACITY OF SCHOOL STAFF

The <u>**DeKalb County School District**</u> will, with the assistance of its schools and parents, educate its teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and schools by:

District and/or schools will building capacity through meetings, workshops, trainings, webinars and resources that will be used to work with parents as equal partners through:

- 1. District meetings for school administrators, principals and/or designated staff.
